
I'm a systematist. That means I discover new species and study their family trees. I specialize in beetles that live on the tops of mountains.

Biogeography

Ever wonder why different plants and animals live where they do? To find out, we have to look into the past. Mountain insects like to be cold so they can tell us how animals moved around the world during the Ice Age.



I study rove beetles – small beetles that have traded the tough armor of other beetles for flexibility. This lets them live in tight spaces, like under rocks and leaf litter.
